Gala

Characteristics:
High yielding with round oval to oval regular tubers with light yellow flesh and skin. High resistance to diseases, good storage qualities, early harvester, low starch content and nice taste. Good for French fries and chips.

Breeder:
Norika (Nordring- Kartoffelzucht- und Vermehrungs- GmbH), Groß Lüsewitz, The Federal Republic of Germany, 2002

Other:
Gala is bred for the European capitalist economy farming system. It has a nice skin that can be washed before distribution to supermarkets. The yellow colour and the oval shape make it ideal for pommes frites- and chips production.

Gala is developed by the breeders who were rehired when the East German Groß Lüsewitz Breeding Institute was transformed into the private enterprise Norika GmbH during the German reunification. Gala therefore carries the robustness demanded by the plan economy system, as well as the visual features that makes it sellable on the capitalist market.

Adretta

Characteristics:
Round tubers with light yellow flesh and skin. Very robust, high resistance to diseases, good storage qualities, mid late harvester, mealy cooking with nice taste.

Breeder:
Karl-Heinrich Möller, Groß Lüsewitz Plant Breeding Institute, German Democratic Republic, 1975

Other:
Adretta was bred for the plan economy farming systems of the Agricultural Production Co-operatives in GDR and Soviet. The round shape makes it roll easily without getting damaged in the large harvesting machines, as well as in the peeling machines of the co-op canteens. The robustness makes it reliable for farming also under poor conditions. Because of its special qualities, Adretta was grown all over the Soviet Union. It is still a much-appreciated variety in this region, especially among subsistence farmers.
